

RANDALSTOWN VIADUCT SET TO BE ILLUMINATED WITH AROUND £500K OF NEW LIGHTS

A planning application to illuminate Randalstown Viaduct has been given unanimous support at a meeting of ANBC's Planning Committee in April.

The application involves the installation of five new black-coloured lighting columns, five metres in height, along the Randalstown Viaduct, a grade B+ listed bridge of special architectural interest. The committee was advised the council is "concerned that the lack of lighting on the bridge is a health and safety issue which needs to be addressed".

Other works proposed include the replacement of the existing arch up-lighting and the refurbishment of the period lighting features on the lattice bridge. It is reported that: "Overall, it is considered that the proposed works will have no significant adverse impact on the existing character and setting of the viaduct, the adjacent Randalstown Bridge and the Randalstown Conservation Area and are acceptable in relation to design and appearance."

The DFC's Historic Environment Division has given its approval subject to conditions including that the lighting colour is to be "warm white" as initially, colour-changing lights illuminating the viaduct had been considered as part of an illumination project to highlight key civic features and built assets in Antrim and Newtownabbey Borough.

The illuminations, expected to cost almost £0.5m, were part of the council's post-Covid economic recovery with the sum of £350k anticipated from the Department for Communities.


